TOURISM HAS A SIGNIFICANT ECONOMIC IMPACT IN SOUTHWESTERN NORTH CAROLINA.

Since its inception in 1987. Smoky Mountain Host has been the regional leader in advocating for the role of tourism as an economic development tool. According to data from the U.S. Travel Association in partnership with the N.C. Division of Tourism, Film & Sports Development, the Smoky Mountain Host regional tourism economy has grown over the past two decades significantly faster than other regions of the state. That growth has been fostered by commitments from our local elected officials, leadership from tourism businesses, Western Carolina University and a strong spirit of "we can do it better working together." This Regional Tourism Economy Pocket Factbook is a tool to help raise the profile of tourism's impact on the local economy and keep taxes lower rather than higher; use it, distribute it.



Eight Year Trend of Annual Tourist Spending






